PCRB CIRCULAR NO. 1686

To All Members of the PCRB:

Re: SUBMISSION OF NOVEMBER 1, 2017 LOSS COST FILING TO REFLECT THE IMPACT OF THE PROTZ DECISION

On Tuesday, August 15, 2017, the PCRB submitted Filing No. C-369 to the Pennsylvania Insurance Department in response to the Pennsylvania Supreme Court ruling in *Protz v. WCAB (Derry Area School District)*. The filing proposes a loss cost change of **+6.06 percent** applied uniformly to loss costs by class (excluding classes 9740, 9741, 0162 and 0164). Proposed loss costs and expected loss factors are attached.

Policies issued with effective dates on and after November 1, 2017 must be qualified as carrying tentative rates, and the Pending Rate Change Endorsement, WC 00 04 04, is to be used for this purpose. Note that such policies issued at current rates or on a “to-be-determined” basis must be endorsed subsequently with the new carrier rates, subject to regulatory action on the proposed loss costs.

The PCRB will continue to assess the impact of the Protz decision. If there is a change in Pennsylvania law due to legislation that addresses this decision, the PCRB will carefully consider the changes and submit a filing based on its analysis. If a change in law makes this filing, No. C-369, unnecessary and occurs with sufficient time before the proposed effective date, the PCRB will withdraw this filing. In addition, the PCRB plans to submit its annual loss cost filing with a proposed effective date of April 1, 2018, in the fourth quarter of 2017.

Overview

The proposed change is based on the PCRB’s analysis of the impact of the Protz decision. The analysis does not include the impact to all workers compensation system costs for two fundamental reasons. First, cost impacts were not included if the PCRB could not reasonably estimate them. Second, many costs are not included as part of loss costs, including loss adjustment expense, underwriting expenses and a provision for profit.

In addition, the filing does not address or include a provision for retroactive changes in cost for claims that are currently open or that have already closed and may reopen, associated with policies in force or that have expired.

Carrier Filings

With respect to carrier filing procedures and requirements, the Insurance Department has provided the following statement for distribution to all PCRB members:

NO ACTION is required of carriers intending to apply their current loss cost multiplier to the PCRB's new loss costs. A carrier wishing to change its loss cost multiplier will be required to make a filing with the Department. Act 44 of 1993 requires all carriers to adopt PCRB loss costs upon approval by the Department. Otherwise, carriers must file their own loss costs which would be subject to prior approval.

Carriers wishing to clarify the status of their current multipliers or to confirm filing requirements applicable for the implementation of any specified schedule(s) of loss costs are encouraged to consult with the Insurance Department, by contacting:
